Voting Information

To be eligible to register to vote a person must:

- Be a resident of Virginia (a person who has come to Virginia for temporary purposes and intends to return to another state is not considered a resident for voting purposes).
- Be a U.S. citizen.
- Be 18 years old (any person who is 17 years old and will be 18 years old at the next general election shall be permitted to register in advance and also vote in any intervening primary or special election).
- Not be registered and plan to vote in another state.
- Not be currently declared mentally incompetent by a court of law.
- Have had right to vote restored if convicted of a felony.

Registration Deadline:

- To register to vote: Oct.24
- Update an existing registration: Oct. 24

VOTERS MAY REGISTER TO VOTE AFTER THIS DEADLINE, THROUGH ELECTION DAY, AND VOTE USING A PROVISIONAL BALLOT.

In-person ID Requirements (bring two of these just in case to prove ID on Election Day):

- Voter confirmation documents you received after you registered to vote.
- Virginia DMV-issued Driver's License or Identification Card.
- Valid United States Passport.
- Any ID card issued by the U.S., Virginia, or a local Virginia government.
- Any student ID card issued by a U.S. university or community college.
- Valid student ID issued by a public school or private school in Virginia.
- Valid Employer-issued photo ID card.
- Any current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document with your name and address.
- An ID Confirmation Statement.
- Valid U.S. Military ID.

Can I vote if I forget my ID?

Yes. You can sign an ID statement affirming your identity; you will be able to vote on a regular ballot. If you do not sign an ID statement to affirm your identity, you may vote on a provisional ballot. You will be provided instructions to ensure your vote will count.

ALL REGISTERED VOTERS IN VIRGINIA MAY VOTE EARLY, EITHER IN PERSON OR BY MAIL.

Absentee Ballot Deadlines:

- Last day to request a mail-in absentee ballot to be mailed to you: Oct. 24.
- Requests must be received by your local Registrar's Office no later than 5 p.m. on Election Day.

Early Voting:

- Starts: Friday, Sept. 19
- Ends: Saturday, Nov. 1

In-person voting:

- Nov. 7, 6 a.m. to 7 p.m.

What to expect:

Election officers will be there to help you.

- Check in.
- Say or write your name and address.
- Show acceptable ID.
- Receive and check ballot.
- Make sure it includes all contests for your district.
- Go to booth.
- On your ballot, fill in your choices and scan when finished.

If you have any issues, please ask an election officer for assistance.

Voters Rights:

- Ask for a new ballot if you want to change your vote before you cast it.
- Vote a provisional ballot if your name doesn't appear on the voter list or you forgot to bring acceptable ID (and refuse to sign an ID confirmation statement).
- Vote if you are in line by 7 p.m. on Election Day when the polls close.

Accessible Voting:

There are accessible voting options at each polling place and early voting location. For more information, visit elections.virginia.gov/accessible.

The order in which candidates are listed within this guide reflects the order they will be presented on the ballot.

This year, we have decided to include the candidates' own statements about various political issues, quoted directly from their official websites without interpretation. The information was copied in the final week of September 2025. We have included QR codes to the websites, so voters can learn more and see any changes candidates may make in the days before the election.

This includes districts 53 (parts of Nelson), 54, (City of Charlottesville, and parts of Albemarle), 55 (parts of Albemarle, Louisa, Nelson, and Fluvanna), 56 (Buckingham and parts of Fluvanna and Louisa), 59 (parts of Louisa), 62 (Greene).

Crime

Crime

“No job is more important for Virginia’s Attorney General than ensuring the safety and well-being of our communities. That means both working closely with law enforcement and local prosecutors to ensure they have the support and resources needed to go after violent criminals and drug dealers, while leading the way in the Attorney General’s office to crack down on domestic violence and crimes against seniors and fight back against the opioid crisis. We also must prioritize getting illegal guns off our streets – a fight I’ve focused on both in the Virginia Legislature – where we expanded background checks and passed a red flag law to get guns out of the hands of domestic abusers – and as an Assistant Attorney General fighting to hold ghost gun manufacturers accountable for putting untraceable weapons on the street. At the same time, we will continue to make Virginia a more just Commonwealth for all its citizens and communities. I’ll work to build closer ties and trust between law enforcement and the neighborhoods they serve, support programs that target the root causes of crime and prevent crimes before they occur. I’ll also work to grow proven violence intervention programs, bolster support for specialty dockets that treat mental health and addiction in the community, and share best practices that will strengthen re-entry programs. Finally, we’ll create an expanded network of regional offices throughout our state to better receive community feedback and input into how best to keep people safe, and expand resources for law enforcement training so they are fully prepared to do their critically important jobs.”

Economy

“I’ll prioritize cracking down on corporate hedge funds that are buying up housing and colluding to raise rent on Virginia families, and go after big banks that discriminate in the housing process so everyone has a fair shot at a safe and affordable place to live. I’ll take on predatory lenders improperly ripping off Virginians who are working hard and trying to get ahead.

We need to level the playing field for small businesses and increase competition by targeting unfair, anti-competitive practices by the biggest multinational corporations who use their

It should be the government's role to facilitate and guide their adoption in ways that grow the middle class, while making Virginia into a world leader in the digital economy – not erect barriers to innovation based on
